

DANGEROUS GOODS REGULATIONS Airfreight Shipments

Shipments with dangerous goods must be handled in accordance with the International Air Transport Association (IATA) regulations for air transport.

Mercury vapour tubes, containing more than 100 mg * of mercury, are regarded to be dangerous goods when transported by air. Articles containing not more than 100 mg of mercury, gallium or inert gas (i.e. Xenon) and so packaged that the total quantity of mercury, gallium or inert gas does not exceed 1000 mg *(1 g = 1000 mg) per package, are not subject to the regulations.

Proper shipping name:	Mercury contained in manufactured articles
UN number and ICAO class:	UN 2809, Class 8
Packing group:	III
Hazard label:	Corrosive
Packing instruction and maximum net quantity per package	Exact quantity of Mercury must be specified

Packing, labelling and Shipper's Declaration for Dangerous Goods according to IATA regulations has to be carried out by a licensed **Dangerous Goods Management Company**.
